




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Dear Sirs/Madams,

The year 2020 was a time of challenges, changes and development for our Foundation. We had to adapt to the new pandemic situation almost overnight. New realities forced us to switch to remote work. Although we were separated from each other, we shared a common goal - to empower children. We did not disappoint!

The last year passed under the motto of security. We had to ensure ourselves secure environment so that we could effectively help children and protect them from abuse. We couldn't leave our clients without support, so we moved our support activities to the virtual world. Consultations with children and caregivers during the lockdown took place mainly online. It required a great mobilization - new competences of our therapists and consultants, equipping them and our clients with the equipment necessary for online communication. Our sponsors helped us a lot.

We did not limit our help, despite the difficulties, and we even extended it! Since March, our 116 111 - child and youth helpline has been operating nonstop - 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We were there for the children when they needed us the most. The increased number of phone calls and messages from children in crisis have shown us that our support is especially important to them. That is why we fought for the welfare of children every time it was threatened, including: we developed recommendations for the Polish government regarding ensuring the safety of children in isolation against COVID-19 and its consequences, and we created the "Behind the Door" and "Pandemic of Violence" campaigns, which sensitized society to violence against children in this difficult time.

We have been implementing our educational plans. In 2020, we organized dozens of webinars for parents and professionals as well as conferences. Thanks to the online form of the events, they were available to all people interested. Our annual Youth Forum attracted a record number of people. As many as 20,000 students participated in the Digital Youth Forum 2020!

We are constantly developing to give children even more strength. We are ready to celebrate our 30th anniversary and for 2021 we have prepared new initiatives that will strengthen the system of protecting children from violence.

Since 2018, we have been coordinating the activities of five centres – Child Advocacy Centres, operating based on the Barnahus model. This model assumes that children victims of crimes, mainly sexual abuse and violence, and their caregivers receive interdisciplinary help under one roof. Child Advocacy Centres implement common standards, and their basic value is the best interest of the child. They offer a place for a friendly interview of children participating in criminal proceedings, as well as medical, psychiatric and legal assistance. The interdisciplinary team of the facility works in cooperation with local services. Currently, the ECF runs three centres of this type – in Gdańsk, Starogard Gdański and Warsaw. The next two centres are run by partner organizations: the Szansa Association in Głogów and the Klanza Association in Białystok.



Goals: providing child victims and their families or caregivers with interdisciplinary help.

Main activities: psychological, psychiatric, and legal help for child victims and their families; supporting professionals who help child victims.

- running webinars for professionals from psychological and pedagogical counselling centre;
- participating in meetings of multidisciplinary teams;
- forensic psychological examinations.



"Abused Child: Theory, Research, and Practice" is a periodical published by the Empowering Children Foundation – a multidisciplinary quarterly journal. Its main goal is to expand knowledge about different aspects of child abuse among professionals including psychologists, educators, health care professionals, lawyers, social policy makers, and others. The "Abused Child" quarterly cooperates with international journals focusing on the problem of child abuse, such as "Child Abuse and Neglect" and "Child Maltreatment".

In 2020, four issues of the periodical were published:

- Quarterly: Vol 19, No 2 (2020): Prevention of sexual abuse of children;

- Quarterly: Vol 19, No 3 (2020): How to support helpers? The perspective of professionals working with children experiencing abuse;

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Legal **Department**

Goals:

providing the Empowering Children Foundation's clients with legal help and services; implementation of the rights of children participating in legal procedures, education and raising awareness among professionals, and advocacy for legislative changes in the field of child protection.

Main activities:

face-to-face and phone consultations for the Foundation's clients; handling the legal aspects of the Foundation's programmes and providing legal interventions. As part of the "Child Friendly Justice" programme: conducting training for judges, prosecutors, legal counsels, police officers, and court appointed experts, as well as for psychologists and pedagogic counsellors on how to prepare children for interviews and how to interview children; publishing activity targeted at professionals, parents, and child victims and witnesses. Workshops for parents of children involved in legal procedures, advocacy for introducing the institution of the guardian ad litem, representing child victims in criminal proceedings. Acting as guardians ad litem for child victims. Carrying out a legal programme "Child Victim Advocate", in which volunteers provide email consultations on child abuse prevention and accompany the Foundation's clients during court trials.

- advocacy for amending the child protection law;
- training for professionals working for abused children;
- training and cooperation with courts within the "Child Friendly Justice" programme;
- participating in the work of the Multidisciplinary Team for Warszawa-Targowek district;
- participating in the work of the Monitoring Team for Counteracting Domestic Violence at the Ministry of Family, Work, and Social Policy.
